Dear Parishioners,

As we gather on this Second Sunday of Easter, also known as Divine Mercy Sunday, we are invited to reflect on the Gospel of John. In this passage, we encounter the disciples gathered in fear behind locked doors, and Jesus appears to them, offering them peace and showing them his wounds. Thomas, who was not present at the time, doubts the disciples' testimony until he sees Jesus for himself.

This passage speaks to us about the nature of faith and doubt. Thomas's skepticism reminds us that faith is not always easy. In our own lives, we may encounter doubts and uncertainties, especially in times of trial and hardship. However, Jesus does not condemn Thomas for his doubt but instead invites him to see and believe.


Like Thomas, we are called to deepen our faith by encountering the Risen Christ in our lives.We may not physically see Jesus as the disciples did, but we can encounter him through prayer, scripture, and the sacraments. Just as Jesus showed his wounds to the disciples, he invites us to bring our own wounds and doubts to him, trusting that he will bring us healing and peace.

Divine Mercy Sunday reminds us of the unfathomable mercy and love that God has for each one of us. No matter our doubts or shortcomings, God's mercy is always available to us if we open our hearts to receive it. As Pope Francis has said, "God never tires of forgiving us; we are the ones who tire of seeking his mercy."

As we continue our Easter journey, may we be like the disciples, who, upon encountering the Risen Christ, were filled with joy and peace. May we also be like Thomas, who, upon seeing Jesus, proclaimed, "My Lord and my God!" May we open our hearts to encounter the Risen Christ in our lives and embrace the mercy and love that he offers us.




Today we should thank God for His mercy and forgiveness and ask Him to look on us and our friends and the whole world with love and forgiveness! Here is a prayer we can say:

Divine Mercy Sunday

Mankind's need for the message of Divine Mercy took on dire urgency in the 20th Century, when civilization began to experience an "eclipse of the sense of God" and, therefore to lose the understanding of the sanctity and inherent dignity of human life. In the 1930s, Jesus chose a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, to receive private revelations concerning Divine Mercy that were recorded in her Diary. St. John Paul II explains:

This was precisely the time when those ideologies of evil, nazism and communism, were taking shape. Sister Faustina became the herald of the one message capable of off-setting the evil of those ideologies, that fact that God is mercy—the truth of the merciful Christ. And for this reason, when I was called to the See of Peter, I felt impelled to pass on those experiences of a fellow Pole that deserve a place in the treasury of the universal Church. Divine Mercy Sunday: St. Faustina's Diary records 14 occasions when Jesus requested that a Feast of Mercy (Divine Mercy Sunday) be observed, for example:

My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. ... Let no soul fear to draw near to Me. ... It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy. —St. Faustina, *Diary*, no. 699


On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

The Image: Jesus appeared to St. Faustina in a vision, with his right hand raised in a blessing and his left touching his garment above his heart. Red and white rays emanate from his heart, symbolizing the blood and water that was poured out for our salvation and our sanctification. The Lord requested that "Jesus, I trust in You" be inscribed under his image. Jesus asked that his image be painted and venerated throughout the world: "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish" (Diary, no. 48) and "By means of this image I will grant many graces to souls" (*Diary*, no. 742).


