## The Music Ministry of St. Pancras

Dear Parishioners,

As we gather on this 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time, we reflect on the Gospel passage from Matthew 22:15-21, where the Pharisees and Herodians attempted to trap Jesus with a question about paying taxes. In this encounter, Jesus provides us with a profound lesson on our dual citizenship in the Kingdom of God and the world.

The Pharisees, often critical of Roman rule, sought to corner Jesus into either endorsing or opposing the payment of taxes to Caesar. They presented a denarius, a Roman coin, and asked if it was lawful to pay the tax. Jesus astutely responded, "Give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God what belongs to God."

This seemingly simple answer holds a profound truth: as Christians, we have responsibilities in both the earthly realm and the spiritual realm. We are citizens of a nation, subject to its laws and obligations. But we are also citizens of the Kingdom of God, bound by His commandments and called to live lives of faith, love, and charity.

In a world where political divisions can run deep, Jesus reminds us to maintain our focus on what is truly important. We must participate in civic life responsibly, respecting the laws of the land and contributing to the common good. At the same time, we should never lose sight of our primary allegiance to God and His moral teachings.

This Gospel passage invites us to reflect on how we navigate the balance between our earthly and spiritual obligations. It challenges us to consider how our actions and choices align with our faith. We are called to be responsible citizens, but also to remember that our ultimate allegiance is to God.

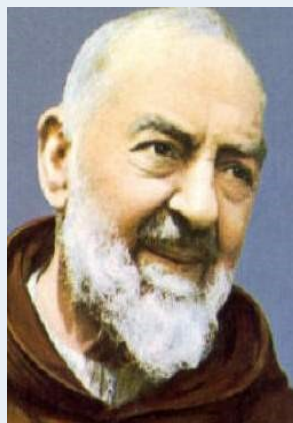
As we go about our daily lives, may we continually examine our actions and priorities, striving to render to God what belongs to God while fulfilling our civic duties. In this way, we can bear witness to the love and justice of the Kingdom of God in the midst of the world's complexities.

Let us pray for the wisdom and discernment to live out this dual citizenship faithfully, recognizing that ultimately, our purpose is to serve God, and by doing so, we can also contribute positively to the society in which we live.

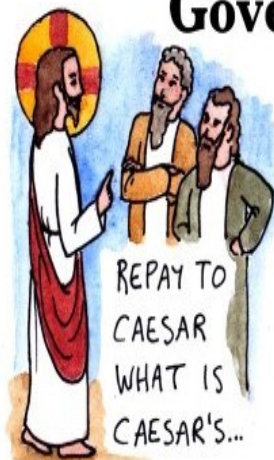

If He said no then He would be speaking against the emperor, but if He said yes then it would seem like He was saying that it was good for the Jews to be ruled by the pagan Romans.

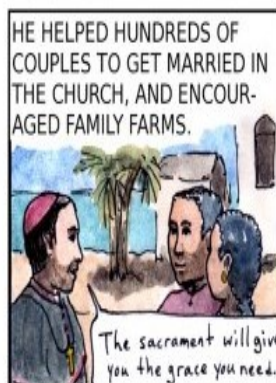
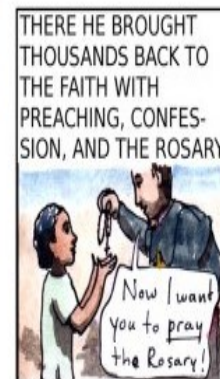
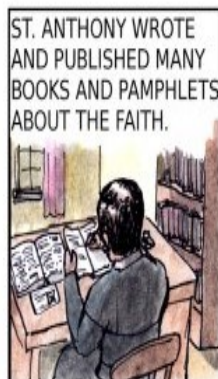
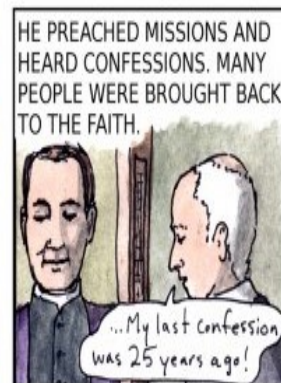
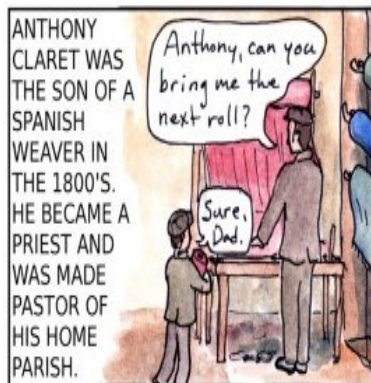
