





As we approach the culmination of Lent, today's Gospel from John prompts reflection on the transformative power of sacrifice and the promise of new life.




This Holy Week, deepen your reflection and prayer. Trust in God's plan, embrace challenges, and allow the seeds of faith, hope, and charity to grow within you.

after a few days, come back to life! And like a plant that grows and produces more seed, the Church would grow


from Jesus and bring other holy people, saints, into the world. Saints are people that are ready to give up their good things and even their lives for love of God, just like Jesus.






