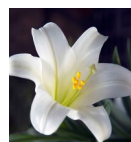

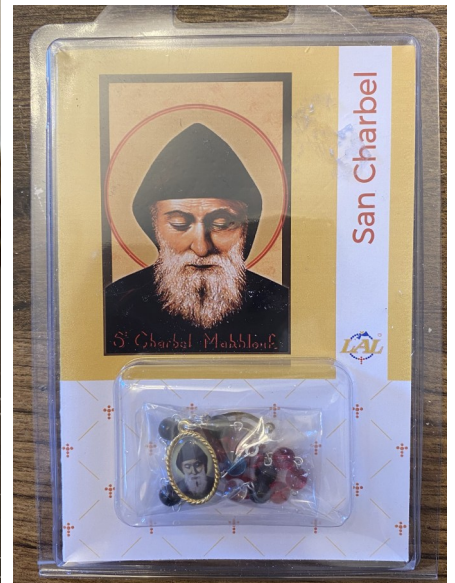
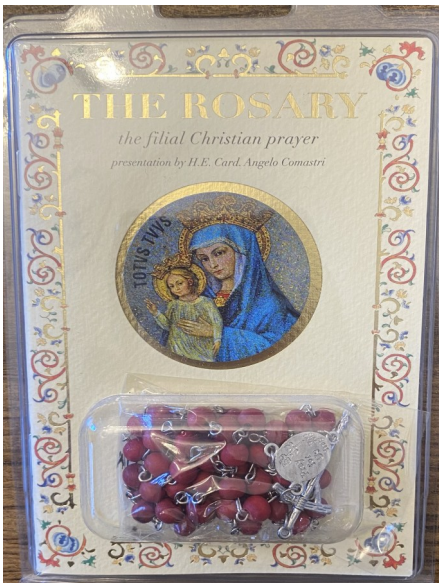

Music Ministry

Dear Parishioners,

First Sunday of Lent

Every Lent begins the same way. We go back to the beginning.

The first reading takes us to the Garden of Eden, a place of abundance where nothing is lacking. Adam and Eve are surrounded by God's generosity, yet temptation creeps in quietly. The serpent does not begin with open rebellion but with a subtle question. "Did God really say...?" Doubt enters first, trust erodes next, and sin follows soon after. What is lost is not just innocence, but communion.

Saint Paul helps us see why this matters. Through one man, Adam, sin and death entered the world. But Paul refuses to leave us there. Where Adam failed, Christ succeeds. Where disobedience brought condemnation, obedience brings justification and life. Lent is not only about remembering the fall. It is about proclaiming that the fall is not the final word.

That truth comes into sharp focus in the Gospel. Jesus is led into the desert, the place of testing, hunger, and vulnerability. He faces the same core temptations humanity has always faced. Trust yourself instead of God. Seek power instead of obedience. Choose glory without the cross. Each time, Jesus responds not with argument, but with Scripture. He remains rooted in the Father's will.

The contrast is striking. Adam reaches for what is forbidden in a garden full of food. Jesus refuses temptation while fasting in the desert. One grasped. The other surrendered. Lent invites us to stand with Christ in that desert and learn again what trust looks like.

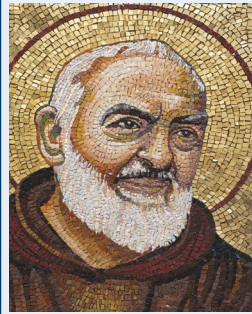
Our fasting, prayer, and almsgiving are not spiritual self-improvement projects. They are acts of trust. They say that God is enough. They train our hearts to recognize the serpent's old questions when they arise in new forms. They help us choose obedience over impulse, truth over convenience, love over self.

As we begin this holy season, the Church places before us a simple but demanding question. Whose voice will we listen to? Lent gives us forty days to answer it again, with Christ, step by step, toward Easter.

What Happens in Lent?

In today's Gospel story, Jesus goes out into the desert to fast and pray for forty days. In the forty days of Lent, the Church asks us to fast, give alms, and pray.



In Lent we don't eat meat on Fridays. Many people give up things like candy or dessert for all of Lent. When we give up food that we like, it reminds us that food isn't the only thing we need- we need God too!



Giving alms means giving money or things to the poor or the Church. God lets there be people who need our help so that we can become better by helping them!

The third thing that we should do in Lent is praying. You could say an extra prayer every day- maybe an "Our Father" or a "Hail Mary" when you wake up or before you go to bed. Another good idea is reading a bit from the Bible, because when we read the Bible we let God speak to us.

What are some little things you could do for Lent? Try to do things that will help you think a bit more about God every day.

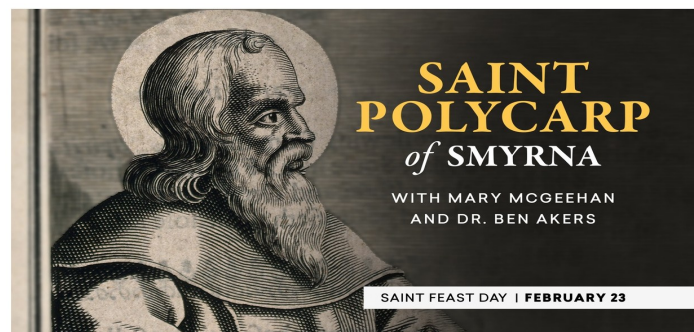
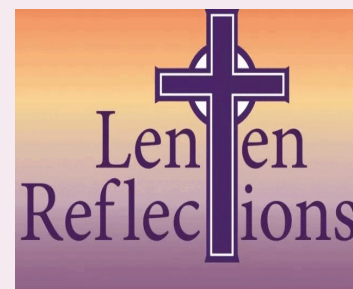

Lenten Regulations

Abstinence: Those who have reached the age of 14 are required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

Fasting: Those between the ages of 18 to 59 are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday. Fasting means limiting oneself to one full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may be taken on two other occasions during the day. Coffee, tea and juice are permitted at any time.

Easter Duty: After they have been fully initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, all the faithful are bound to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled in the Easter Season unless, by good reason, it is fulfilled at another time.

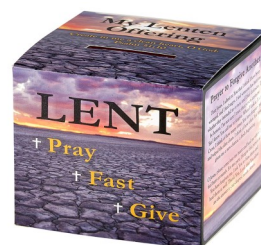

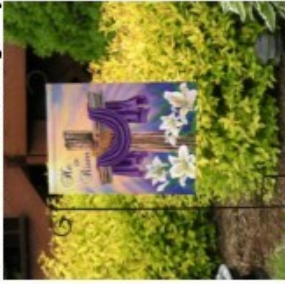
