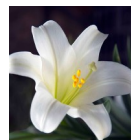

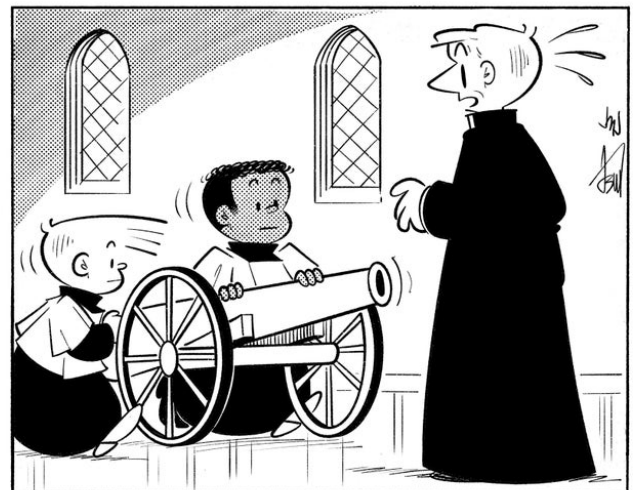

Music Ministry

Dear Parishioners,

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This mystery is at the heart of our faith. We believe in one God in three Divine Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It is a mystery that we can never fully explain, but it is not distant from us. The Trinity reveals who God is. God is love. God is communion. God is a relationship of perfect love.

In the first reading, Moses goes up Mount Sinai and encounters the Lord. God reveals himself as "merciful and gracious, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity." This is important because the Trinity is not just an idea to study. The Trinity is the living God who comes close to his people. Moses knows the people have sinned. He even calls them a "stiff necked people." Yet he still asks God to remain with them, pardon them, and receive them as his own. That is the heart of our relationship with God. We are weak, but God is faithful.

The Gospel gives us one of the most beautiful lines in all of Scripture: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son." God does not remain far away from our struggles, our sins, or our pain. The Father sends the Son, not to condemn the world, but to save it. Jesus reveals the face of the Father. He shows us that God's love is not cold or distant, but personal and sacrificial. The Son enters our world so that we might have eternal life.

Saint Paul also gives us a glimpse into the life of the Trinity when he says, "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you." We hear similar words at Mass often, but today we can hear them with new attention. The Christian life is meant to be lived in the grace of Christ, the love of the Father, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit. We are not called to isolation, bitterness, or division. We are called to communion with God and with one another.

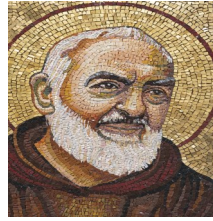
Every time we make the Sign of the Cross, we proclaim this mystery. "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." It can become so familiar that we rush through it, but it is a prayer of great power. It reminds us who we belong to. It reminds us that we were baptized into the life of the Trinity. Today, may we slow down, give glory and praise to God forever, and ask the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit to dwell more deeply in our hearts, our homes, and our parish.

The Holy Trinity

Today we are celebrating the feast of the Holy Trinity. "Trinity" means "three" and tells us that there are three Persons in God. There is only one God, but God is a relationship of the Father and the Son (Jesus) and the Holy Spirit.

Each of the Persons in the Holy Trinity is really God, so the Father is really God, and Jesus is really God, and the Holy Spirit is really God. But they are not all the same Person. Each of the Persons in the Holy Trinity is also equal to all the others. So the Father is not greater than the Son or the Holy Spirit; they are all equal.

Sometimes we can understand the Holy Trinity as if it were like a family. Each of the persons is different, but the family wouldn't really exist if any one of them were missing. The Holy Trinity is also a relationship of love. Because God is so full of love He wanted to share it with others, so that is why He made us! When we live the way God wants us to we are joining in the life of the Holy Trinity. Isn't that amazing?

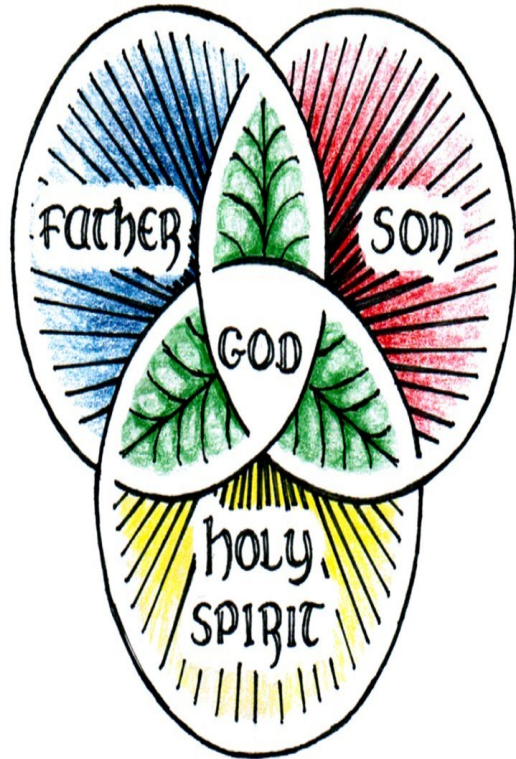


Answer to puzzle on front page: Three Persons in One God.

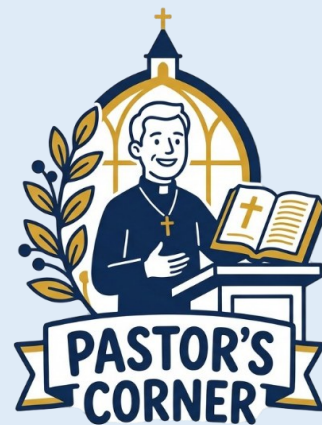

DEVOTIONS, EXPLAINED!
-PRAYER AFTER MEALS-

Just as praying before a meal, praying after a meal is meant to inspire in Christians an attitude of thanksgiving and an acknowledgment of our dependence on God.



Though it is a less common practice in the modern world, early Church fathers like Tertullian and St. Jerome extolled the importance of praying after a meal, and the Christian poet Prudentius composed hymns for before and after meals ("ante cibum" and "post cibum").

There are no "official" prayers for after a meal, but the most common one said by Catholics is this: "We give thee thanks, almighty God, for all your benefits, who lives and reigns forever and ever. And may the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God rest in peace." It is a benediction which recalls our perpetual fellowship with the entire Body of Christ, including those who have passed from this life.

—ST. JUSTIN | JUNE 1—

St. Justin Martyr (c. 100 – 165) was born in the Palestinian province of Samaria in the town of Flavia Neapolis to Greek parents. Justin's education was a classical mix of history, poetry, rhetoric, and philosophy. The future saint was fascinated by philosophy and studied in the various schools from stoicism to Socratic and Pythagoras to Platonic. Although he favored the Platonic school, he felt that the philosophical schools were missing something.

Justin continued to seek a higher truth. He was struck by the Christians he saw being persecuted for their beliefs. He observed these early martyrs go to their deaths fearlessly and wondered at the truth and peace they carried. He met an old man who spoke to him of the prophecies of the Jewish people and of Christianity. These powerful witnesses worked a conversion in Justin, and he was baptized around the age of 30.

The saint was most likely an ordained deacon, spending time at Ephesus with the Jewish population, and in Rome. He is most well known as the author of apologies, or explanations, of the early Church. These important texts give detailed descriptions of the early Church. The elements of faith and the Mass he gives correlate directly to how Catholic's believe and practice today. His witness also shows that the Church of the second century read from the same texts as we do, he mentions the first three Gospels, the letters of Paul and 1 Peter, and is the first known to quote the Acts of the Apostles.

Eventually, Justin's evangelical activity caused him to be arrested in the reign of the Emperor Marcus Aurelius in 165. He, along with six companions, was scourged and beheaded by Rusticus, a prefect of Rome. An eyewitness account of his martyrdom still survives. St. Justin Martyr, pray for us!
