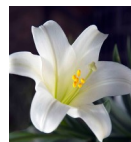

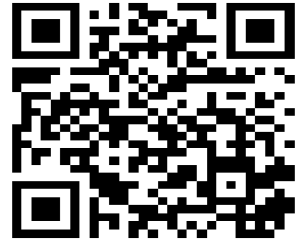

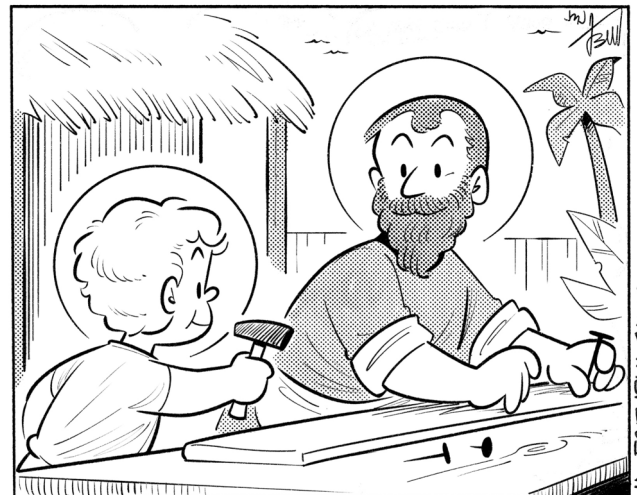

## Music Ministry

Dear Parishioners,

"Fear no one."

Those three words from Jesus are simple, but they are not easy. Fear has a way of becoming very loud in our lives. We fear what people think. We fear being misunderstood. We fear failure. We fear rejection. We fear standing out. Sometimes we even fear doing the right thing because we know it may cost us something.

Jeremiah knew that kind of fear. In the first reading, he hears people whispering against him. Even his friends are watching for him to make a mistake. He is surrounded by opposition, but he does not give up. Why? Because he knows the Lord is with him "like a mighty champion." Jeremiah is not brave because life is easy. He is brave because he has entrusted his cause to God.

That is the same courage Jesus asks of the Twelve in the Gospel. He sends them out to speak the truth, but he does not pretend that everyone will accept them. Instead, he tells them not to be afraid. The message they have received in the darkness must be spoken in the light. What has been whispered must be proclaimed on the housetops.

This does not mean we need to be loud, harsh, or forceful about our faith. It means we cannot be ashamed of Christ. We acknowledge Him in the way we speak, in the choices we make, in the way we treat others, in whether we forgive, in whether we pray, in whether we live differently because we belong to Him.

Jesus also gives us a beautiful reminder of our worth. Not even a sparrow falls without the Father's knowledge. Even the hairs of our head are counted. In other words, God sees what others miss. He knows the burdens we carry, the quiet sacrifices we make, the fears we do not say out loud, and the faith we are trying to hold onto.

The world often tells us that we are only worth what we produce, what we own, how we look, or how others judge us. Jesus tells us something very different: "You are worth more than many sparrows." Our value comes from the Father who created us, the Son who redeemed us, and the Spirit who strengthens us to testify.

So this week, we can ask ourselves: Where am I letting fear silence my faith? Where is Jesus asking me to acknowledge Him more clearly? Maybe it is in a conversation, in a family situation, in a workplace decision, or simply in choosing to pray when life feels heavy.

The Lord does not promise that discipleship will always be easy. But He does promise that we are never forgotten. The same God who sustained Jeremiah, who hears the cry of the poor, and who counts every sparrow, is with us now.

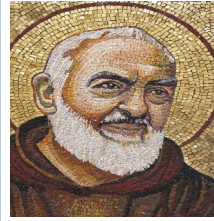
So do not be afraid. Speak the truth with love. Live your faith with courage. Acknowledge Christ before others, and trust that He will acknowledge you before the Father.

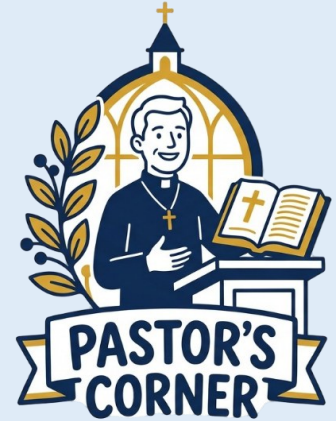

Que este verano sea para ustedes y sus familias un tiempo de verdadero descanso y renovación espiritual. Sepan que llevan en mis oraciones.



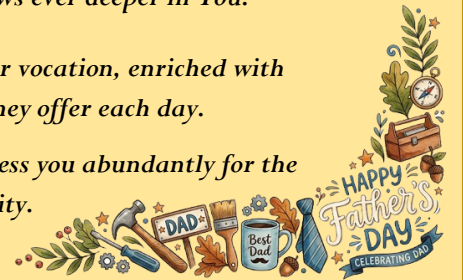

## DEVOTIONS, EXPLAINED! —MARIAN CONSECRATION—

Marian consecration, the act of consecrating oneself to Jesus through the intercession of his Blessed Mother, is actually rooted in the words of Jesus himself when he beseeched



the Apostle John to look upon Mary as his mother (John 19:27) and to "take her into his own home." He was actually instructing us all to do likewise — to "behold your mother" and take Mary into our hearts, for wherever she is beloved, Christ is known and praised.

St. Maximilian Kolbe described Mary as "the stairway to Heaven." Marian consecration, therefore, could be likened to climbing the stairs. Different formulas exist for spiritual development in preparation for the consecration, based on the writings of saints like St. Louis de Montfort, and there are different prayers for the act of consecration. However, there is no "right" way to consecrate oneself to Jesus through Mary, so long as the ultimate goal is closeness to Christ and the glorification of God.
